Patriot PAWS quite simply could not do what we do without our many volunteers. People often ask us why we don't use rescue dogs. I wish we could, but not knowing the dog's history is a risk that we simply can't take.

A dog can suppress stress from his past that can surface with no warning from an unknown trigger, and that could be disastrous for both the dog and the veteran. Even puppies can experience trauma through a traumatized mother dog. Many, if not most, of our veterans are already dealing with their own post-traumatic stress and depend upon their service dog to stay calm and attentive to help them keep calm, so we must do everything within our power to make sure that each of our dogs is as dependable as possible.

Our mission is and always has been to provide the highest-quality service dogs possible for our nation's disabled veterans, and it will continue to be just that. They deserve nothing less.

Navy PO2 **Mikki** served Stateside for 12 years. She was a hospital corpsman & served attached to the Marine Corps. Mikki was injured multiple times, both during her service, & afterwards as a firefighter and EMT.

At our Spring '24 Graduation, Mikki received service dog **Dubey**, a male black Lab. According to Mikki, "Dubey has certainly made life worth living again! Dubey FORCES me to be a better person in every way. I honestly wish every veteran suffering from a disability of ANY kind could have a service dog, especially one as magnificent as my Dubey Jewel! He's simply amazing!"

In Their Own Words

Now and then, we'd like to share with you what we hear back from our veteran recipients. Tricia received Hoge in our Fall 2023 Graduation.

"Can I tell you how I feel about Patriot Paws [sic]? Waiting...it seemed like forever and then it wasn't. The time arrived and I met so many wonderful people in Gatesville. It was an amazing and emotional week.

Trust the process. I heard this phrase from the beginning. I totally believed it and then I met Hoge. Believe in love at first sight? I do, Hoge was a bit hyper but the energy is something I found she matches. She is an over greeter HAHA, so am I. She is NOT afraid of wheelchairs. Oh I had tread her paws a time or two but she has learned to watch out for my wheels. I had the opportunity to work with many dogs and my goal was to trust the process but then there was Hoge and I just fell in love. She worked with me so perfectly. She does not think of it as work but play. I met some amazing veterans from all services that week and we stay in contact even now.

All the training does not prepare you for the growth of your heart. I believe as I grew in hers I knew she grew in mine. I never wanted a dog. I needed a helper. I think I found both.

As a veteran who is a Suicide survivor, I am certainly glad I failed that one, I truly believe that pairing me with a service animal has a critical place in my life. I do wonder how many veteran suicides could be prevented with the pairing of the veterans with a truly trained service dog as I received from PP? Not only does Hoge work with my daily needs of picking things up, closing doors and getting me out. She picks up on my moods. I do not know how, maybe we don't put up walls to our dogs the way we do people. She gets up



close to me when I need it and even does a paw if she notices me starting to stress and we both get away to a quieter place.

My life is better with Hoge but I truly believe it was not just her breeding but her training under PP. To me, the training PP did is what made the difference.

It made the difference in my life and that is a fact. I am a better, happier and more productive person since being paired with my Hoge and a big thank you to Patriot Paws [sic]!"


